Q. Have you not at various Periods been called upon by Mr. Allen, I Mr. Broughton and Lt. Govr. Sorell to make up your accounts, and so what reason or circumstance has prevented you from complying with their requests? A. I was called upon after I was relieved by Mr. Broughton in Octr., 1816, and I have been prevented making up my accounts from not being able to procure the receipts and issues of Stores and Provisions from the beginning of the year 1816, till the time I was relieved, from the Store keeper Maum.

Q. How had the returns of receipts and Issues been made to you we before the commencement of the year 1816 by Maum? A. I supplied be him from my office with the returns properly ruled and divided, and he made them out weekly and sent them to me.

Q. Why Did he cease to do so in the beginning of the year 1816 and why, if he Did cease, did you not call for the weekly returns to be made? A. My accounts fell in arrear in consequence of the multiplied queries sent to me by Mr. Allan from Sidney, and Maum did not afford me the assistance I stood in need of to make up my Provision and Store accounts. After he quitted the office I had no Power to compel him to Produce any accounts.
