SOUNDCLOUD RECORDINGS

If you are having trouble with low volume on our SoundCloud recordings, and turning up your normal computer volume doesn't help, we suggest you try the following steps:

- If you are using external speakers, make sure they are turned up (there is usually a volume knob on one of the speakers).
- When you press 'play' in SoundCloud, at the very bottom of the screen you can see a bar with the controls to play, fast forward/back, a progress strip, and a volume button next to that check that this is turned up.
- Try playing it in another browser (Chrome, Safari Firefox etc).
- Test it through some headphones (most computers have a standard audio port that can take the same headphones as your phone or iPod).

If it is still too quiet, it is probably related to your computer and there isn't anything we can do. There is a SoundCloud app for Android and Apple phones, which is worth trying if you are able to access it.
