






WHY CONTINENTS MOVE - THE BOILING BILLY ANALOGY


Convective drag pulls 'continent'
(heavy lump of porridge) apart





Porridge 'continents' aggregate into
'supercontinents' (big lumps)





Porridge supercontinent
breaks up











































































INTRUDING THE DOLERITE



TYPICAL DOLERITE MOUNTAIN AFTER EROSION




