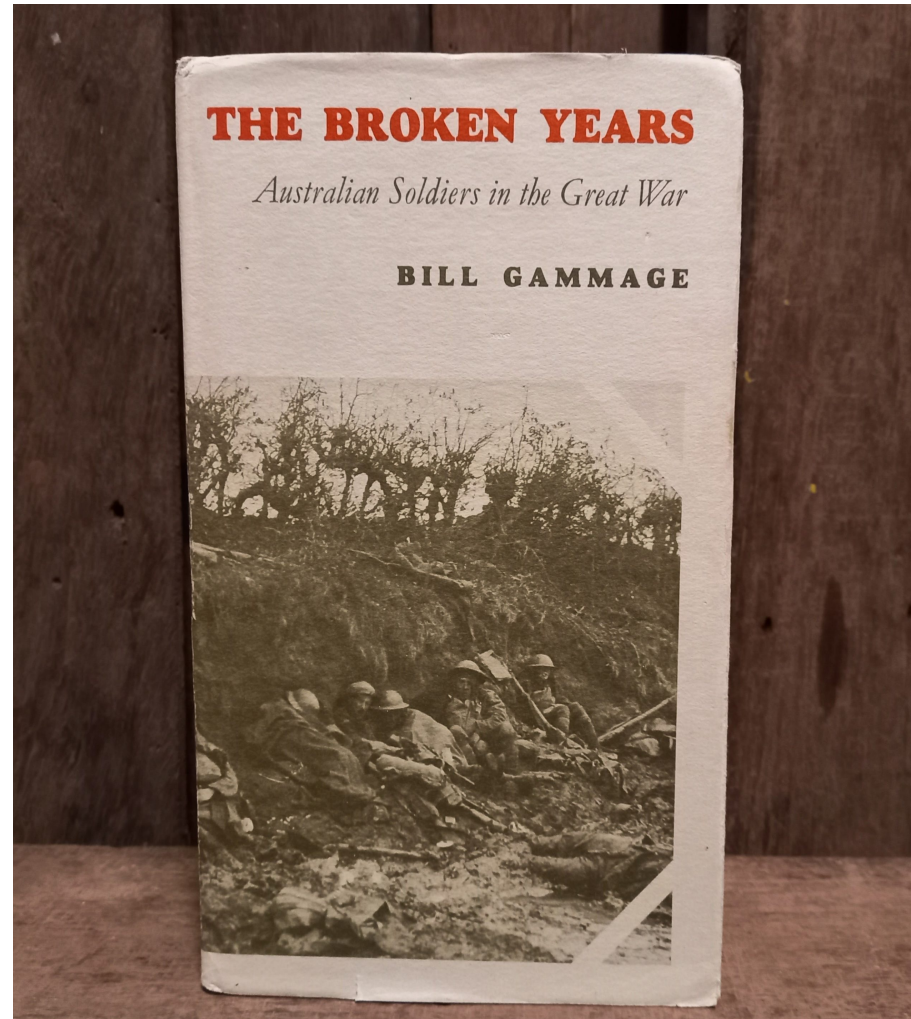

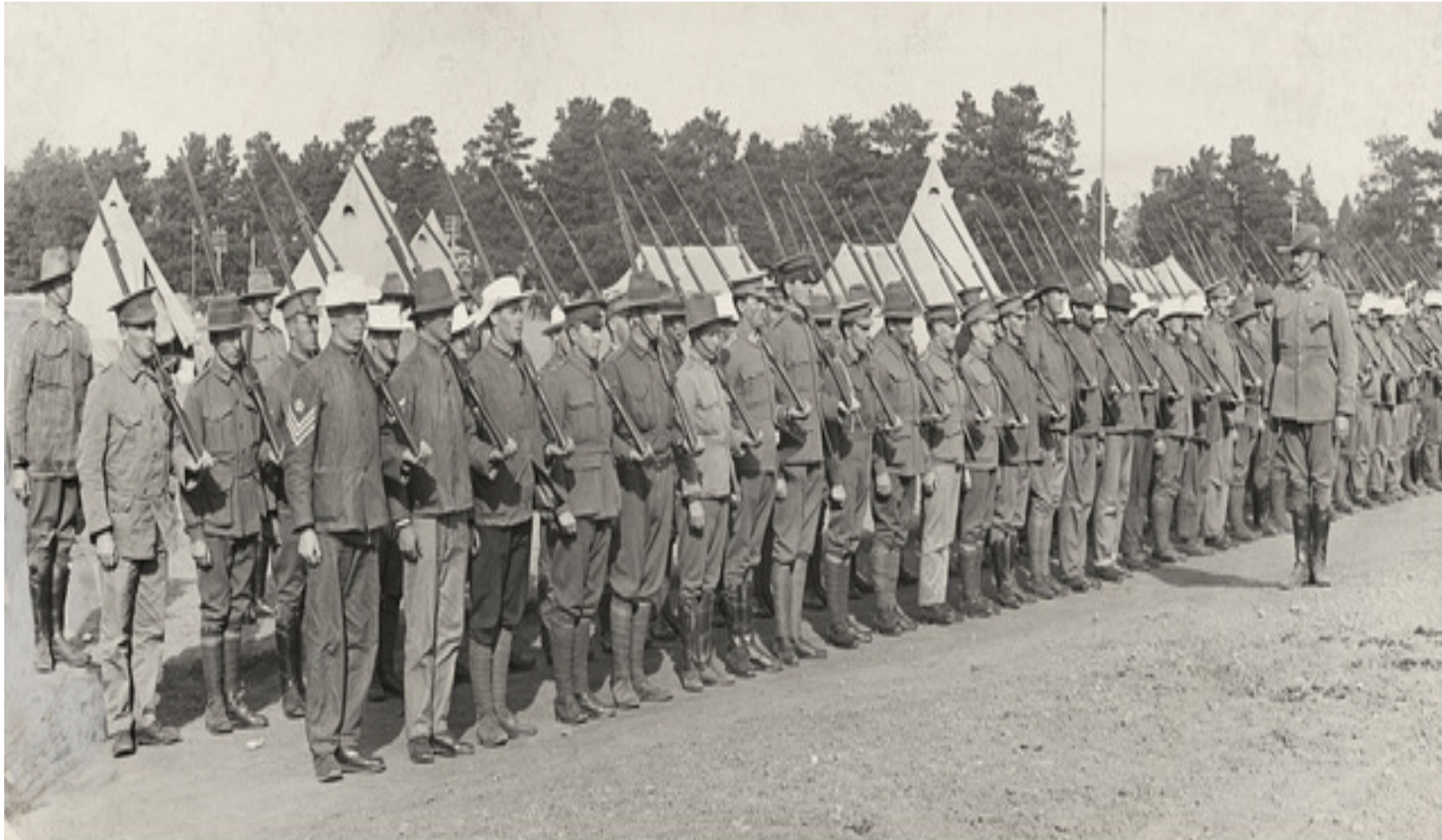

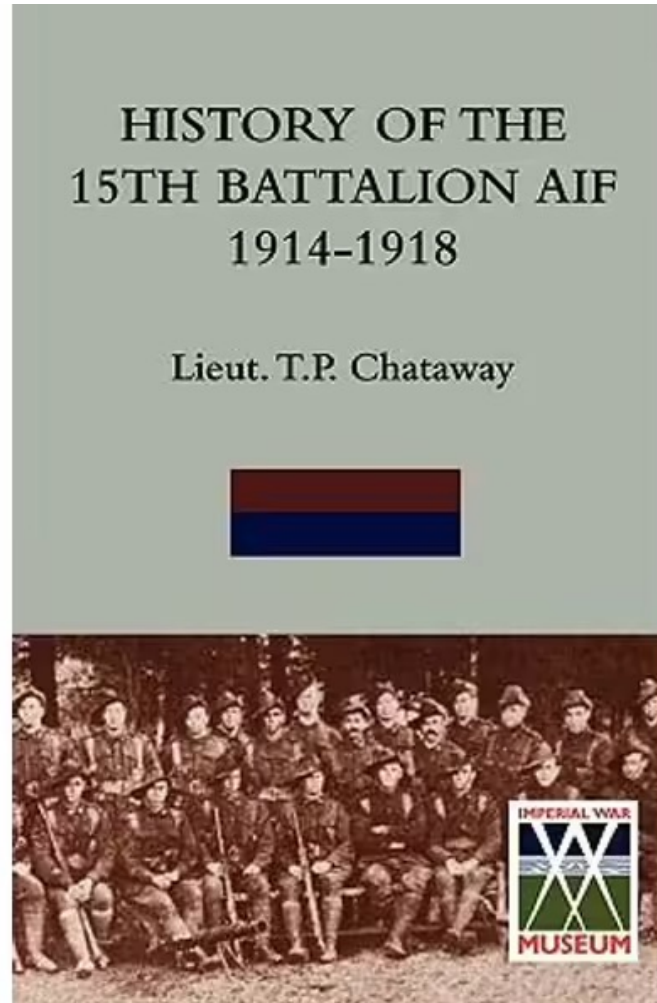

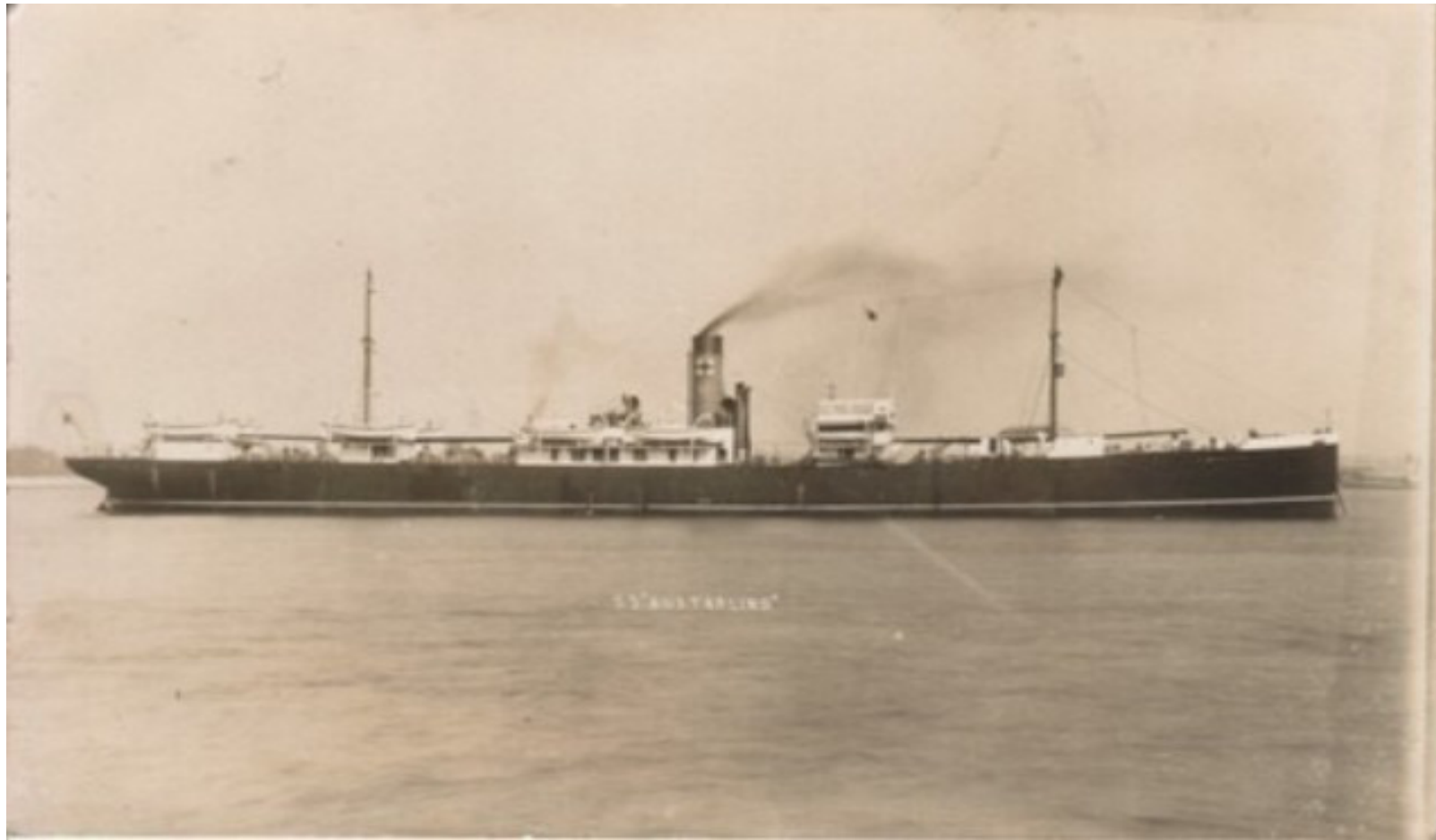

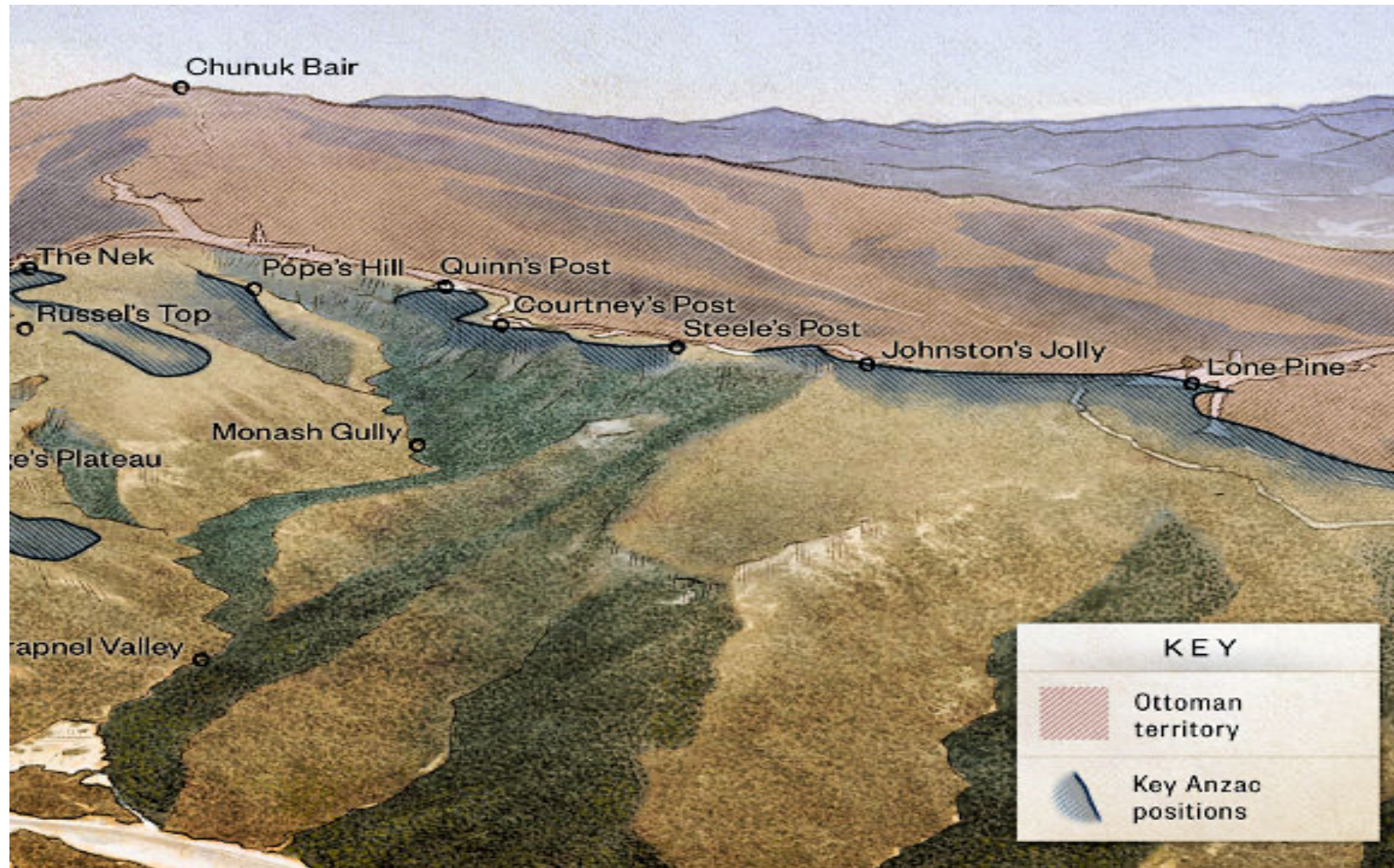

Mrs. T. K. Robson was born in Sydney, and is a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Donald Macleod, of Sydney. Upon her marriage in 1895 she lived in



Launceston, and has always been associated with deserving organisations and causes in that city. She was one of the most able women organisers during the Great War, being secretary of a number of bodies which aimed to raise funds to send comforts to the soldiers. Among other organisations, she was the secretary of the French Red Cross Society, and, at the end of the war was decorated with the Médaille d'Reconnaissance Française. She has been secretary of the St. John Ambulance Association since 1919, and also secretary of the Red Cross Society for a number of years. She is a justice of the peace and a special magistrate of the Children's Court, Launceston. Her husband died three years ago. One son, Keith, was killed on Gallipoli, another, Alastair, is manager of a branch of the Commercial Bank, Sydney, while another, Ian, is attached to the Tariff Board, Melbourne. Her two daughters, Misses Marcia and Patricia Robson, reside in Launceston.
