












Te Tiriti o Waitangi/The Treaty of Waitangi 1840



'The Treaty is ... a group of nine documents: seven on paper and two on parchment. Together they represent an agreement drawn up between representatives of the British Crown ... and representatives of Māori... Named after the place in the Bay of Islands where it was first signed on 6 February 1840, the Treaty was also signed at locations around the country over a seven-month period' – Archives New Zealand
